

HOW TO PLAN WHAT YOU NEED TO LAY YOUR GRASS YOURSELF

Working out what you need to install artificial grass is easy - simply calculate the area you want to cover with the grass by using the grid on page 3 (look at the example on page 2), following these simple steps:

1

Draw your garden and the area you wish to cover with artificial grass. Try to plan your area so that the grass will be laid with the minimum amount of joints possible, ensuring that all sections run in the same direction. This will aid your installation and ensure a more professional finish.

Keep in mind that grass from Artificial Grass Ltd comes in 2m and 4m widths, and is available in lengths of up to 25m. We also provide an allowance of approximately 20cm at the end of every order placed with us.

Work out the square meterage of grass you need to order, this will also be the quantity of geotextile layer you need (you need this to stop weeds growing through).

Then calculate the length of the join between sections as this will be the amount of jointing tape you need, and will determine which type and quantity of adhesive you require.

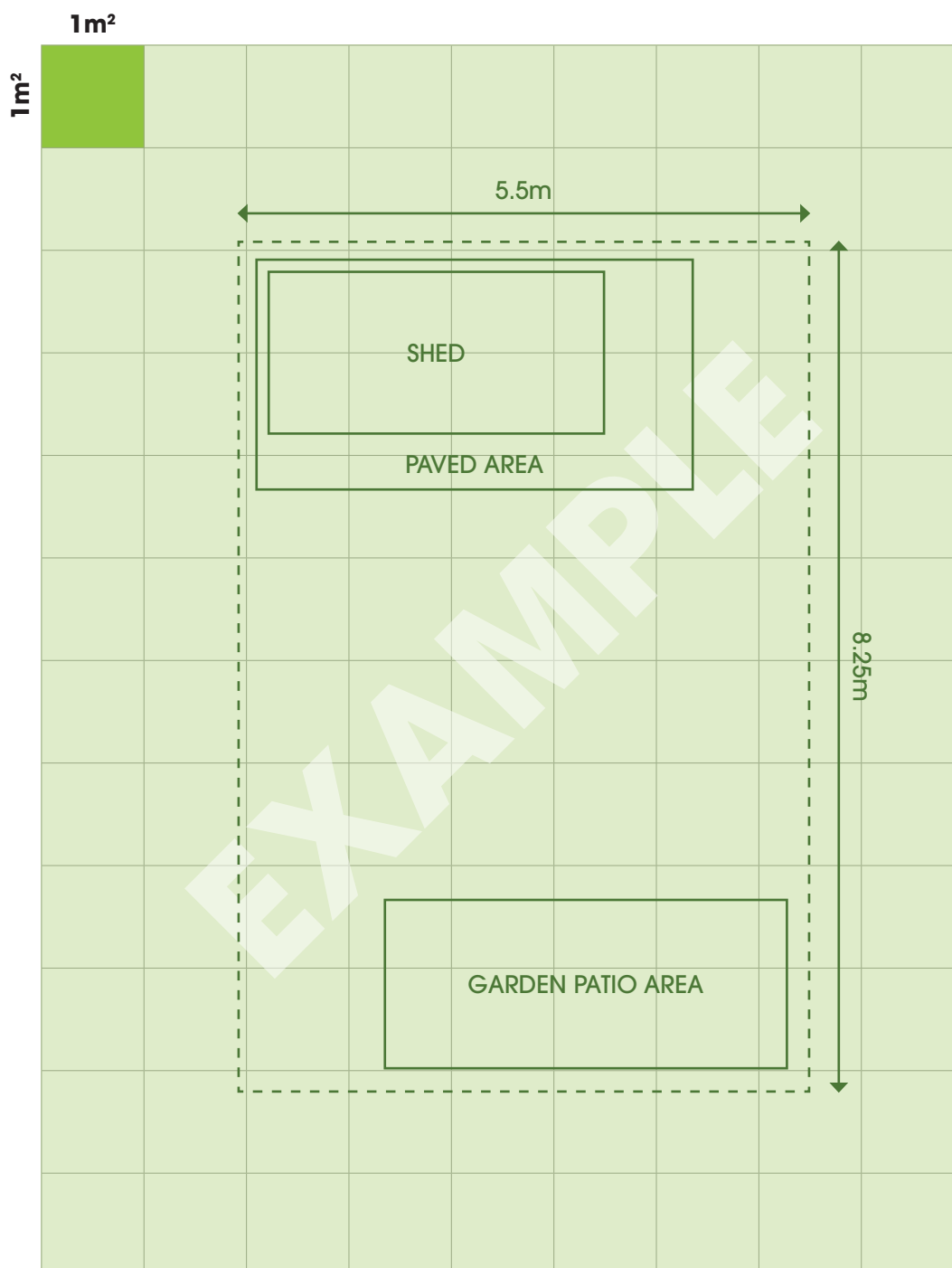
